Kaikōura has a secret – It's our Museum.

Come and discover our extensive collections and stories of Kaikōura's natural and human history. Journey though our award winning exhibitions where we bring to life the incredible mysteries of Kaikōura's unique and fascinating history.

Our Natural History collections include weird and wonderful marine collections from ear bones to eggs, bottles of fish specimens to a 2m giant sea sponge and phalanges.

Our Human History collections include precious and practical taonga Maori, whaling and fishing memorabilia, every type of tool, engine and gadget you would need to build a village. UFO's, surfing and shipwrecks.

Our Social History connections include the changes in environmental perceptions from whaling to whale watching, from killing to ecotourism.

Explore how Kaikōura has adapted to geological influences including earthquakes, and how can we work together to protect taonga and endangered species— how do we become a Kaitiaki?

The Museum has linked our collections to the curriculum, outlining potential opportunities for your students to explore to enhance their learning about Kaikōura. Each topic can be suited to fit your class level, number, experience and time.


What used to be ok is now no longer acceptable, what happened? Why did we change? What turned the tide?


